Healthy Homes Ilfracombe

- NDDC Purchased 3 properties and made an offer on 1 other
- Designs are being finalised
- Funding is now in place but are yet to go to tender and so don't know the final costs (still doubts about fulfilling specification). NDC (Sarah-Jane) are now in a position to re-engage with the housing group to looking at a compromise re: heating
- Aim - Construction completed by the end of 2026. Measures will be developed to capture learning (opportunity to include lived experience in developing meaningful measures)
- District Council agreed to take a lead to enable this group to remain updated, have opportunities to ask for further feedback where possible, or advise on decisions being made and the reasons for this.
- The District Council project team are working hard to incorporate the feedback from the housing group and to date their requirements are forming part of the solutions that now need to be costed.

Landlords charter

- Landlord engagement event held at the Lime Kiln Cafe on the 19 March 2026 by NDC - shared NDC team contact details for queries relating to housing complaints, housing inspections, licensing of HMOs and Park Home Sites, adaptations for disability and Energy Efficiency. Information shared about the Renters Right Act, Decent Home standards, Trading standards 'buy with confidence' scheme, energy and efficiency schemes. Request from attendees for pre-application planning advice and for other ways to access support as landlords.
- Aim - to develop a package of products and 'bank of trades' to support landlords as part of the Landlords charter
- Opportunity - NDC to think about using their Engagement HQ software (risk - is not relational approach but NDC have an intention to repeat engagement in 6 months with landlords)

Adult education and employment

- One Ilfracombe have recruited a community engagement officer (Mary)
- The Work & skills pilot group discussed ways to improve marketing & take up of courses on offer as some have not had any referrals.
- North Devon College (fna Petroc) have recruited a Director of Adult Learning, who will start on the 23rd April 2026 (John Laramy, Group Principal & CEO). His line manager will be able to connect them after they start, as he is likely to be the lead contact for your group in Ilfracombe. 'We are very keen to be involved in the work in Ilfracombe and in North Devon more widely.'
- Learn Devon (DCC) have recruited some new tutors in the North and could begin to explore the Skills Gaps that you have identified in the work of the Poverty and Truth Commission. We have recently been delivering tailored learning short courses for 19+yrs, and potentially have the availability to plan and deliver in Ilfracombe over the next few months.
- DWP outreach at the Candar is still monthly as the jobcentre do not have resources to extend at present; youth hub, resource ring fenced (support services); able to provide info to childcare support to improve access; now holds funding for 19+ education (incl. Learn Devon); jobcentre local plan will review skills gap to inform delivery plan
- Together Drug and Alcohol Individualised Placement Support (IPS)- Together Drug and Alcohol Treatment service now have a small team of workers who identify employers who are willing to provide employment placements for people engaged in recovery and also look to buddy service users up with employers. In March 2026, they had their 1st successful placement. Rich has connected them with Charmain to discuss work in Ilfracombe that seeks to provide employment opportunities to people.

Ilfracombe campus development (incl. humanise charter and 'No,but' alternative offers)

- Prioritised desired 'features' with Community Commissioners
- Forming working group
- Align with emerging opportunities - Encompass volunteer peer navigators, Integrated care pathways

Ilfracombe centre Quality improvements (incl. information window)

- Cllrs have allocated a small budget for changes to the Ilfracombe centre in 2026 and there is the intention to implement changes

Quality improvements (QI) - Wellbeing hub

Wellbeing Wednesday:

- has social prescriber link workers for 2.5hrs each session to support, share information and signpost (appointments can also be booked)
- Services are invited to engage with the group (e.g. Energy 361)

Humanise principles

Devon Public Health have:

- Taken principles to strategic commissioning hub (ICB)
- Included principles in direct award contract for 2027/28 Drug and alcohol services (Wave3) with request to evidence how they meet standards
- Presenting standards to SCAA and Devon Public Health team in summer 2026
- Common ground CIC (working out of Co-lab Exeter) are running lived experience workshops as a space to consider the standards

Opportunity/Action - for all partner organisations to present the principles (along with the understanding poverty video) to their boards (Action - Rich M to share with Ken)

Team around the person process

- TAP embedded with Health & justice (probation) project as a test and learn in Ilfracombe. information governance agreements process in place between partner legal teams to agree that data can be shared.
- Intention for TAP approach to be the model for complex needs Multi Disciplinary Teams work across Northern Devon.
- RDUH are trying to embed this approach in Royal Devon NHS Trust proposals.
- DPT is actively contributing to the TAP pilot, which is focussed on a defined cohort of individuals and has offered dedicated local mental health input. There has been close engagement from local service leadership, with a focus on learning what makes a practical difference for people with complex needs.

Popultaion health mangement approach

- Andrea has created a framework incl. 20% most deprived an 'plus groups', frail, SMI, C&YP and multiple comorbidities - demonstrates need for different interventions aimed at different groups of people in need.
- ICB agreed to support further development (Ginny and Andrea to meet)

Staff resources

- ICB is happy to help with the development of an ICB package. Lead - Collette Eaton-Harris - Serious Violence & Trauma Lead, Safeguarding Directorate
- ICB and partners creating a trauma-informed commissioning pack (work in progress) incl. importance of TI, expectation of services to deliver and measure to understand the impact of trauma. This pack will contain PTC resources (nested under 'poverty')
- Uses material from the PTC, ICB Trauma Stabilisation Learning Programme and TI work within RDUHT
- Examples of trauma informed commissioning will be referenced in the training programme (e.g. ITRS)
- Action - Request for ICB to share developments with PTC partners to explore integrated use (Ginny)

Your story tool

- Shared with civic and community commissioners for consultation.
- These changes have now been incorporated, and the resource is in its finalisation stage before wider availability.

Received extensive feedback around:

- Language: ensuring wording was trauma informed, accessible, and sensitive.
- Prompts: refining questions to encourage openness without overwhelming or retraumatising.
- Accessibility: adapting format and design to meet diverse needs, including clarity, readability, and inclusivity.

Cultural bids

- Involved a Lived experience voice (Karen). Whilst unsuccessful, the 2025 Arts Council England bid included PTC Values
- PTC Values were a core part of the 2026 Pride in Place bid. If shortlisted bid will be developed further and will involve people with lived experience

Ripples

- **Multi-Agency Referral meetings** - aimed at integrating support for people whom there are safeguarding concerns/challenges services are facing with individuals- a recent case in Exeter actually included the individual whose situation was of concern in the meeting - this example must have helped overcome the issue of consent/information sharing.
- **RDUH bids** (Lynsey) No funding materialised yet, but we have used learning from the PTC to inform proposals around neighbourhood teams and RDUH neighbourhood proposals (via Partnerships and Health Inequalities team).
- **RDUH Board** - Desire to review the main board committees terms of references and/or pose a series of questions from the NHSE Health Inequalities statement for each committee to report back on i.e. does the data they receive include HI etc
- **Crisis and resilience fund** - DCC/NDC have an intent to co-design the crisis support fund with people with lived experience
- **Comms** - People are talking about poverty. PTC raised profile
- **Hilldales Care Home**- Richard Merrifield (DCC Public Health) has met with Hilldales and promoted the IPTC to them and encouraged them to extend their links into the wider community. Hilldales take their residents outdoors and connect them with various activities to improve their emotional health and wellbeing. Mary confirmed Carl from Hilldales is bringing people to Wellbeing Wednesday.
- **Individualised Placement Support** (IPS)- Together Drug and Alcohol Treatment service now have a small team of workers who identify employers who are willing to provide employment placements for people engaged in recovery and also look to buddy service users up with employers. In March 2026, they had their 1st successful placement. Rich has connected them with Charmain to discuss work in Ilfracombe that seeks to provide employment opportunities to people.
- **BtheChange** a delivery partner of the STaR project in Exeter providing drug and alcohol treatment to rough sleepers have just employed 2 peer support workers.
- RDUH and One ilfracombe **pop-up Collaborative Wellbeing Event** for over 60s on Thu 30/04/2026

Patient story for the NHS Trust Board

'Understanding of poverty' video shared with the Board of Directors, with cover paper to ask board members to reflect on the implications of this story, for Royal Devon, in its role as a provider of acute and community NHS services, particularly how they support people to connect to the right service for their needs

- Used to remind the board of their duties under the H&SC Act (not to exacerbate inequality and to engage communities in the delivery of healthcare.)
- Made a massive impact on the Board members - Many of the members later shared their own backgrounds incl. Fathers' alcoholism and prison sentence; childhood with domestic violence and poverty.
- Currently the board cannot be sure their services are not judging people based on their poverty or deprivation.
- Board members felt that their reaction to this issue, commitment to working in partnership and the link to NHSE Neighbourhood Health (prevention) should inform an entire RDUH strategy reset.
- They want to share the video widely, using for staff inductions and relevant meetings
- Ensure poverty is part of the executive's agenda (incl. Safeguarding, impact on children; deprivation profiles)
- A review of the main board committees' terms of reference and/or pose a series of questions from the NHSE Health Inequalities statement for each committee to report back on i.e. does the data they receive include HI etc
